Luther, in his first sermon at Wittenberg on March 9th, 1522

"The summons of death comes to us all, and no one can die for another. Therefore, everyone must himself know and be armed with the chief things which concern a Christian. In the first place, we must know that we are the children of wrath, and all our works, intentions, and thoughts are nothing at all. Secondly, that God has sent us his only-begotten Son that we may believe in him and that whoever trusts in him shall be free from sin and a child of God. Thirdly, we must also have love and through love we must do to one another as God has done to us through faith. Fourthly, we also need patience. For whoever has faith, trusts in God, and shows love to his neighbor, practicing it day by day, must his needs suffer persecution. For the devil never sleeps, but constantly gives him plenty of trouble."

We know these 'chief things' of which Luther speaks. We know that we must strive to display the evidence of those 'fruits of the Holy Spirit'; love, joy, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control, as people living in community with one another.


Lord of Life Literary Society (Book Club)

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

If I had to title this article it would be "Stewardship is FAITTH IN GOD". I know what some of you are thinking, "Here it comes again talking about money. Why does the church always have to talk about money? It's time to pay our dues!"

Am I correct - did you think of any of these things as soon as you saw the title.

If we look at stewardship, we find in the ELW page 107, prayer after the offering:

Blessed are you, O God, maker of all things. Through your goodness you have blessed us with these gifts: ourselves, our time, and our possessions.

Financial stewardship is more than money. It is our time and talents too. Although these are very important to the proclamation of the gospel of Jesus Christ, this is part of our commitment where we step out of our comfort zone challenging ourselves in new ministry.

The other part is the finances which are the inner workings of every church. The power bill has to be paid if you want to be able to worship in comfort during the summer and winter. Fellowship hall and offices have to have air-conditioning when it is in the middle of summer. Ministries of the church need to be sustained financially, Sunday school material for the children, music for the choir. The altar guild won't have communion supplies for us on Sundays. There would be no paper or ink for us to have bulletins on Sunday. Without these things, the building will simply be an empty dark vacant building on the street.

Also, part of our financials goes to help our synod do ministry and also the ELCA do ministry. Which means, we help out not only locally but synod, churchwide and globally.

Ministry comes with faith and sacrifice. Jesus did not tell the disciples that ministry was going to be easy. Moses wandered for 40 years; Paul struggled. However, what did they all have in common? FAITH! They had to rely on God and find their PEACE IN HIM! This faith and peace often came after they failed repeatedly on their own, and humbly came to the Lord-realizing that they had to stop trying to do it their way. They humbly had to admit that God was providing for their needs.

Brothers and Sisters, stewardship is FAITH. FAITH that God will provide, and we help along with him for our needs. Notice I didn't say wants-only needs.

When I was at seminary, in one of my classes, a professor explained to us how important to fill out the commitment cards and make a commitment to tithing. To be accountable for my giving. It wasn't necessarily important for the budget, but it was important as a testament to myself about my own faith and spiritual journey.

My professor challenged us to try giving 1% more each month than I had the previous month. He challenged the class to try this for 3 months. His answer to my questioning expression was "you don't make a decision about a job in the first month or so, so why would you do this about supporting a ministry for God?" He also encouraged us to give first and then use the rest that was left for our daily living. He encouraged us to live within our means. Our professor told us if after 3 months we could not live without that extra money, he would personally give it back to us.

I thought about it, prayed about it, and took the challenge. For the next 3 months I did give 1% more than I had the previous month. Did I miss it? My professor didn't have to write any checks to the class. He did ask us "has your life changed in anyway since you made this commitment?" At the time, I really couldn't see much difference, but over the next few years amazing things began to happen. I will claim that this hasn't always been the way for me. I still occasionally stumble, but God has a way of letting me know who controls my life.

A friend of mine who has been a stewardship chairperson for many years, also taught me another valuable lesson. He told me that for many years, before he joined the stewardship committee, he believed that was the big givers that supported the congregation. He said that he realized that it wasn't that it was everyone's gifts that supported the ministries of the church. Every dollar, quarter, dime, nickel and penny had a place in a ministry for God.

He encouraged me to look at every face in the congregation as a gift from and for God. He encouraged me not to judge a person by what I thought they gave or by their perceived social standing in the congregation. He encouraged me to help others become accountable for their spiritual walk with God. Teaching everyone that God should be first in every area of their lives. Be a model to teach them to humbly walk with HIM every day.

Try the test, commit yourself to the 1% test, make yourself accountable to others. Make a commitment to give no matter what. If you don't attend regularly, mail it in or drop it off. Try it for 6 months.

Peace of mind, heart and spirit come from true faith and God. Each of you are important to the ministry of Lord of Life and more importantly for the Glory of God.
