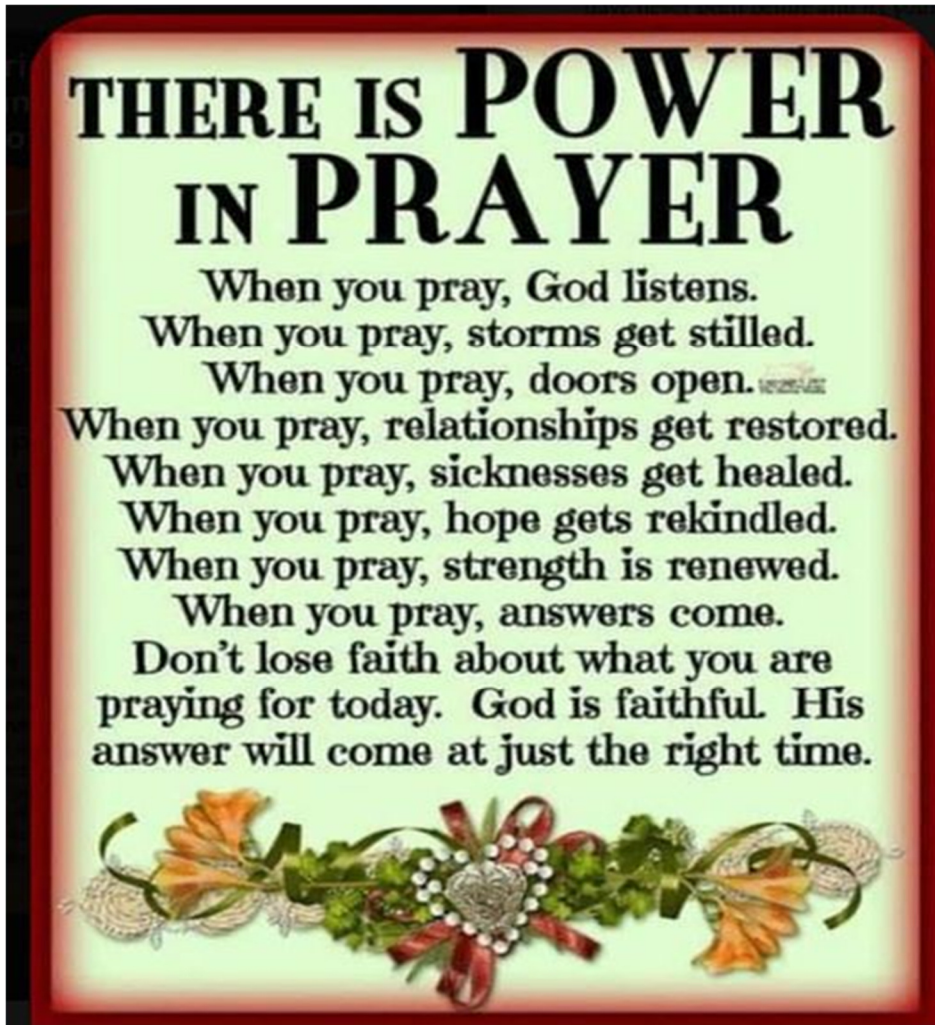
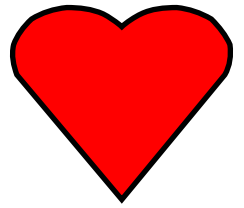

It is very clear that no matter what version of the Bible you choose to read, to study, and to dwell in, God wants to drive home the notion of 'love'; HIS notion of love. The above numbers represent how many times the word 'love' is contained in each of the mentioned biblical text translations.

Here we are, once again, in a month where greetings cards and candy companies will fill store shelves with endless opportunities to tell someone "I love you"; and you and I will participate in this yearly ritual and find joy in it. The question is...where does that joy come from? How do we express God's love in this?

For God's children, it is not the words of affection or the sentimental notions we will communicate inside a card; and it is not the flowers or the candy that we pass along to a loved one that expresses His agape love. God's love is expressed in the response, the call, and the anticipation of joy that our loved one(s) will feel and receive in our desire to bind that relationship with them together, to build it up, and to hold on to it tightly. It is the same response we are compelled to express to one another and to our neighbor every day. We are called to be imitators of God's humble, relentless, loyal, and servant driven love. It is this agape love that unites us, binds us together, and allows us to feel its joy even in the midst of the storms that our lives will bring.

CHURCH APPROVED 2026 BUDGET

GREAT NEWS! 2025 BUDGET HAD ANTICIPATED A -\$7,349 NET LOSS ,BUT WE ENDED THE YEAR WITH A POSITIVE NET GAIN.

2026 INCOME BUDGET: WE RECEIVED 19 PLEDGES TOTALING \$98,050.00, AND \$42,000.00 FROM THE USE OF BUILDINGS. WE PROJECTED ADDITIONAL FAITH REVENUE OF \$88,950.00 TO BRING OUR ESTIMATED INCOME TO \$229,000.

2026 ESTIMATED EXPENSES: \$228,793.00 WHICH SHOWS US A POSITIVE \$207.00 GAIN BY YEARS END.

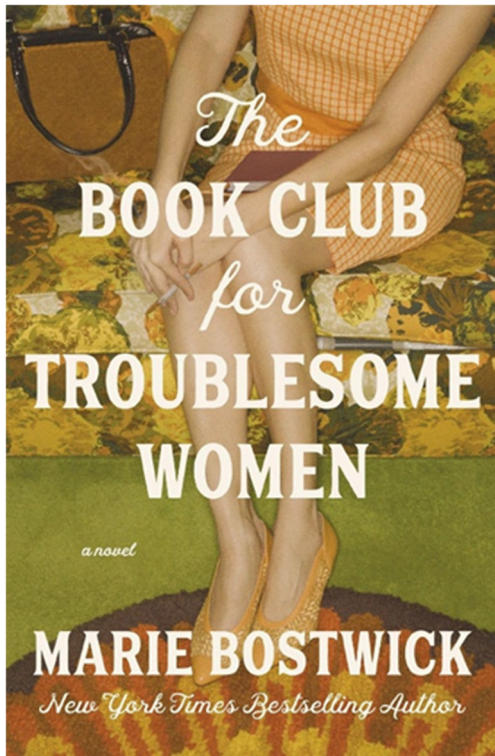

Since ancient times, our Jewish brothers and sisters have celebrated the Seder Dinner to recount and remember God's promises while they wait for Messiah. Today, as Christians, we stand on their shoulders and look beyond the cross and remember the great love Jesus has for us by celebrating the Agape (Love) Feast.

The Agape Feast is a service of Holy Communion and fellowship as we share a traditional first century meal much like our Corinthian ancestors ate. The service combines Psalms, Bible readings, hymns, and sharing communion at our tables. Then, as a community, we sing our way into the sanctuary to complete the service by stripping the altar and hearing Psalm 22 read in the quiet and darkness. We leave in silence to contemplate Jesus' abundant love for us as He willingly gave His life for ours.
