



The Importance of Prayer

In the book of *Prayer by E.M. Bounds, he writes,* "The most important lesson we can learn is how to pray. Indeed, we must pray so that our prayers take hold of God. The man who has done the most and the best praying is the most immortal, because prayers do not die. Perhaps the lips that uttered them are closed in death, or the heart that felt them may have ceased to beat, but the prayers live before God, and God's heart is set on them. Prayers outlive the lives of those who uttered them — outlive a generation, outlive an age, outlive a world."

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

As we are moving past Easter and towards Pentecost, we often forget about another festival of the church. You ever heard of the "forgotten festival". What am I speaking of? "The Ascension of our Lord". Perhaps it's because it usually falls on a Thursday. Perhaps it's overshadowed by the grand festival of Easter. Whatever the reason, many simply overlook the importance of this Holy Day. For your reference, this year, the Ascension of our Lord falls on May 29th (but always occurs forty days after Easter). We may wonder at times why Jesus didn't just stay on earth after His death and resurrection. One could make the argument that life would be so much better if only Jesus had stayed on earth to be our Shepherd and King. Wouldn't it be wonderful if we could just call up Jesus on the phone and tell Him our troubles and ask for His counsel and blessing? That said, I assure you that because Jesus ascended into heaven, we can go to Him, and He will hear us and continuously give His blessings. Listen to what Jesus tells His disciples, "Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you." (John 16:7) In other words, it is for our good that He returns to His Father, because when Jesus leaves, He will send us the Holy Spirit. It is through the Spirit that we are guided and directed into God's knowledge and truth. The Holy Spirit's work is powerful, and it is just as real today as it was on the day of Pentecost (which, by the way, is observed ten days after the ascension of Jesus which means this year it will be on Sunday, June 8th). Ascension Day, however, is the coronation celebration of our Lord as He is proclaimed to be King of the universe. Jesus' ascension to the Father is His entrance to the greater existence beyond the confines of time and space, being no longer bound by the limitations of His state of humiliation. Seated at the right hand of God, Jesus now intercedes on our behalf and for our good. Yet, our Lord remains present with us who remain bound by time and space. He is with us as true God and true man, exercising His rule in the Church through the means of grace which He established: His Word and His Sacraments. So, the Ascension of our Lord is a time of celebration and a source of comfort for all who trust in Jesus. He has the ability and authority to keep all His promises to you. And He will surely do it.
